Although this course is designated for physicians, other disciplines are encouraged to attend. The APLS Course focuses on the evaluation, diagnosis and initiation of treatment of many pediatric medical and surgical emergencies during the time the patient's condition is being stabilized in the clinic or emergency department. Major topics to be addressed include Pediatric Assessment, Pediatric Airway, Central Nervous System, Medical Emergencies, Cardiovascular System, and Trauma. Advanced Airway and Advanced Trauma Procedures skill stations will be included. The course will require advance acquisition of the textbook APLS: The Pediatric Emergency Medicine Resource and independent study and completion of online "Check Your Knowledge" questions for six chapters. 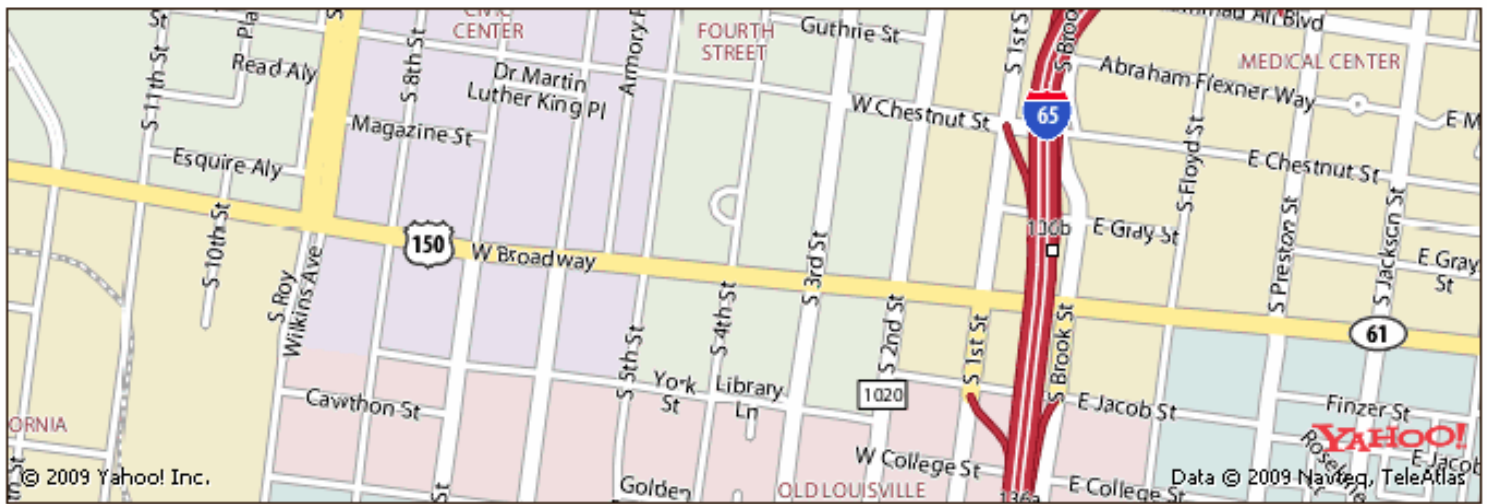
General Information
